

Royal Roads University Factsheet – August 2009

Annual grants

- Operating grants in 2008/09 were \$15.8M rising to \$17.2M for 2009/10, for an increase of \$1.4M.
- Operating funding to Royal Roads has increased by \$8.3M, from \$8.9M in 2001/02 to \$17.2M in 2009/10 – a 93.3 per cent increase.

Student spaces

- Funded a total of 1,980 student spaces for 2009/10, up from 1,968 the previous year.

- Funded spaces to Royal Roads University have increased by 130, from 1,850 in 2003/04 to 1,980 in 2009/10 – a seven per cent increase.

Capital projects: Over \$24.5M since 2001, including:

- \$20 million (includes a \$3M federal contribution) for construction of the new Learning and Innovation Centre. The new facility includes classrooms, seminar rooms, computer labs, faculty offices and support spaces for staff and students.

Special funding

- In 2008/09, RRU received Aboriginal Special Project Funds of \$99,950 for the Yekooche First Nation and Royal Roads University Governance Capacity Building Project.
