

Simon Fraser University Factsheet – August 2009

Annual grants

- Operating grants in 2008/09 were \$194.5M, rising to \$213.4M for 2009/10 for an increase of \$18.9M.
- Operating funding to SFU has increased by \$72.5M, from \$140.9M in 2001/02 to \$213.4M in 2009/10 – a 51.5 per cent increase.

Student spaces

- Funded a total of 20,105 student spaces for 2009/10, up from 19,464 the previous year, and the 2009/10 figure includes 109 new graduate spaces.

- Funded spaces to Simon Fraser University has increased by 3,255, from 16,850 in 2003/04 to 20,105 in 2009/10 – a 19.3 per cent increase.

Capital projects: Over 513M since 2001, including:

- \$49.4 million (includes a \$24.4M federal contribution) for the renovation of the Schrum Science Building.
- \$10 million (includes a \$4.6M federal contribution) for an expansion to Podium 2 on the Surrey campus.
- \$69.8 million for the new Surrey Central City Campus. Acquisition and fit/up of space within the Central City building.
- \$34.5 million for the Health Sciences Building, Burnaby Campus. Simon Fraser University opened a new faculty of health sciences which focuses on population and public health, with the goal of reducing the amount of disease, premature death and disability in a population through prevention programs. The new facility includes classrooms, teaching and research labs, and academic support space.
- \$36 million for the relocation of the School for Contemporary Arts. The new facility within the Woodward's redevelopment site includes an experimental theatre and support space, teaching studios, offices and public space.
